## Best Quartile

Of note, Crawley is amongst the best of all LAs on a range of economic measures, known to have an impact on longer term health and wellbeing...



**83.3%** of adult population are **economically active** (Jul 2017-Jun 2018)



**7.95:1** **Very high ratio of private sector jobs to public sector jobs**, of the areas tracked by the Centre for Cities, Crawley has one of the highest ratios.

## Age Structure

The resident population has a **younger profile compared with England**, with 22% aged 0-15 years (England=19%) and only 13% aged 65+ years (England, 18%),



## Ethnically Diverse

**28%** of the local population were from black and minority ethnic (BAME) groups at the time of the last census (2011). This was higher than England (20%).



**33%** of the population aged 0-15 years were from BAME groups



**12%** of the population aged 65+ years were from BAME groups

## Getting Better



**Teenage Pregnancy** has fallen over the last 10 years, from 39.3 per 1,000 15-17 year olds in 2006 (77 conceptions) to 23.5 per 1,000 in 2016 (43 conceptions)



**Deaths (under 75 years) from cardiovascular disease** have fallen over the last 10 years from 97.1 per 100,000 in 2005-2007 to 72.3 in 2015-2017, although the rate of decline has slowed in recent years..

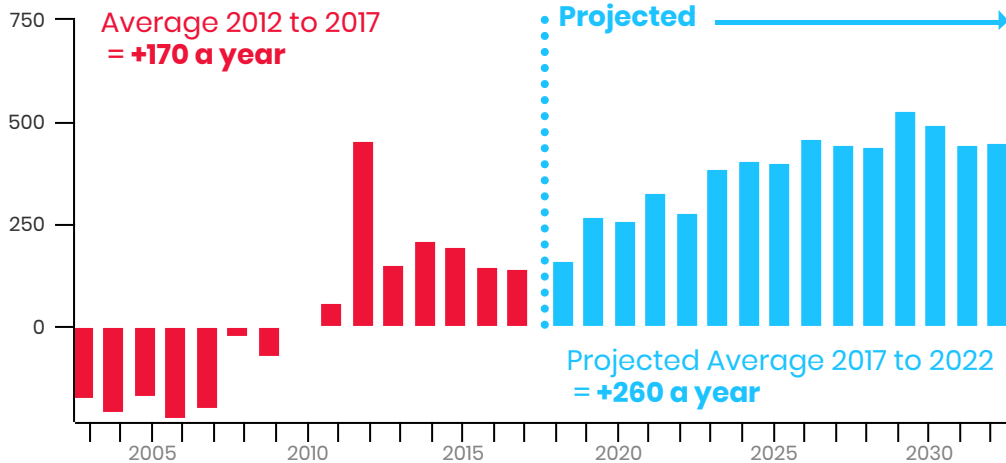


# Crawley - Challenges

## 14,900 people aged 65+.... and the pace of change is increasing

Crawley has a relatively young age structure. However in the next 10-15 years, the pace of change in the 65+ age population will increase.

## Need to reduce harms & threats to health

### Screening rates in Crawley are low compared with national rates



- 71.4%** The proportion of women eligible for **breast screening** who have had a test with a recorded result at least once in the previous 36 months
- 68.6%** of eligible women attending **cervical** screening within target period (3.5 or 5.5 years)
- 54.2%** screened for **bowel cancer** in last 30 months (2.5 year coverage, %), 4th lowest of comparable local authorities

The **rate of violent crime** in Crawley (recorded offences per 1,000 pop) has increased in the last 5 years. From a rate of 14.6 per 1,000 in 2012/13, to a rate of 32.0 per 1,000 in 2017/18 (3,564 offences)

## Life expectancy has increased but considerable inequalities persist... and a notable gap in relation to men

Life expectancy is lower for people with mental health problems and for people with learning disabilities.

## Maximise prevention opportunities

### Childhood Obesity



**Approx. 18%** of Year 6 pupils (10/11 year olds) are obese.

### Alcohol



**524 alcohol-specific hospital admissions** in 2017/18.



**Smoking \***  
**Estimated 19,600 adults are current smokers** (18% of 15+ population)



### Physical Activity (and inactivity)



In 2016/17 **62% of adults were estimated to be physically active** (doing 150 minutes of moderate intensity exercise per week), **24% physically inactive** (<30 minutes of moderate intensity activity).
