Residents 140,100

9% increase since 2007, in the main due to inward migration to the area from other parts of the UK, a 7+% increase is projected in next 10 years

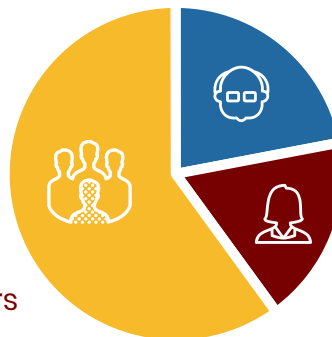

Age Structure

The resident population has an **older age profile compared with England**, with 18% aged 0-15 years (England=19%) and 22% aged 65+ years (England, 18%)



Poverty

5,250 Housing Benefit claimants in May 2018.

2,700 Older people living in poverty (2015 data from index of deprivation)

1,750+ Children aged 0-15 yrs living in poverty

Getting Better



- **Teenage Pregnancy** has fallen considerably in Horsham
- There were **15 teenage conceptions in 2016**, down from 57 in 2006.

Life Expectancy has improved for men and women over the last 15 years.

82.3 years

For **MEN**, life expectancy has increased from 78.7 years (2001-2003) to 82.3 years (2015-2017)

84.7 years

For **WOMEN**, life expectancy has increased from 82.7 years (2001-2003) to 84.7 years (2015-2017)

At the time of the 2011 Census...



Over 3,500 people 65+ were carers

1,000 caring for 50 hours a week or more



7,500 people 65+ lived alone and at greater risk of loneliness,



40%+ of households in areas classified as rural

In 2011, this included 4,600 lone pensioner households

Importance of the wider determinants of health

Housing Affordability

- 14.2 : 1**
- Horsham has the highest **lower quartile house price to lower quartile earnings ratio** (14.2:1) in the West Sussex.
 - In 2018, of the 2,370 properties sold in Horsham only 1 in 4 was less than £300,00*.

The number of people killed or seriously injured (KSI rate) on roads in Horsham is significantly higher than England.



In 2015-17 there were **274 people killed or seriously injured**, representing a rate of 65.9 per 100,000 population (England rate of 40.8)

Increasing number of older people means that, using existing prevalence assumptions, by 2030 Horsham will have.....



1,200+ more older people living with dementia
current estimate 2,200, projected to increase to 3,500



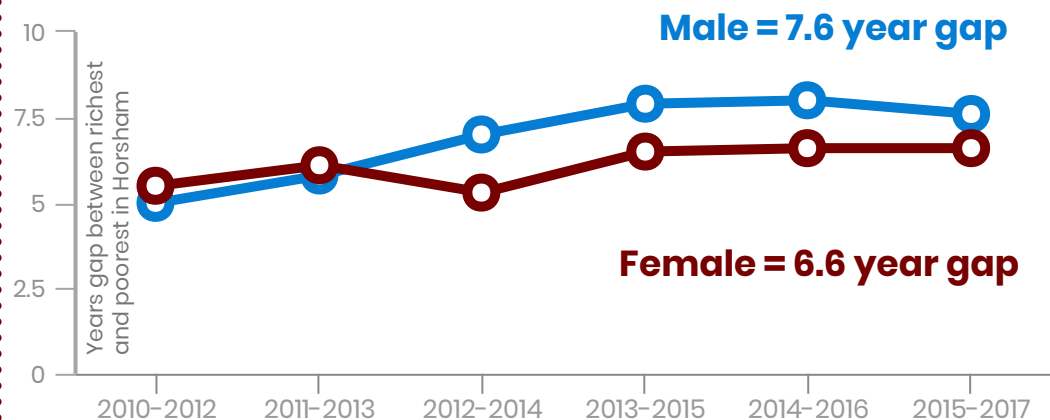
500+ more older people with sight loss

The gap between **life expectancy** of the people in the most deprived areas compared with the least deprived has increased



Maximise prevention opportunities

Childhood Obesity



Approx. 12% of Year 6 pupils (10/11 year olds) are obese.

Alcohol



684 alcohol-specific hospital admissions between 2017/2018.



Smoking

Estimated 10,000 adults are current smokers (9% of 18+ population)



Physical Activity (and inactivity)

19% adults estimated to be **physically inactive** (spending < 30 minutes doing moderate intensity exercise per week).



67% adults estimated to be **physically active** (doing 150 minutes of moderate intensity exercise per week).
